This term, P3 have been busy learning and growing in so many ways! In Maths we've been focusing on counting to and backwards from 20, looking at different maps and learning preposition words such as under, over, on, between and in. The students are also practising important social skills such as sharing, taking turns, using kind words, building friendships and confidence in the classroom. We love seeing their curiosity and creativity shine every day! Well done P3!







P4 has settled into 2025 at full speed. In mathematics students have been learning about number names, digits and items, 1 more and 1 less and location for example in front of, forwards and backwards and giving basic instructions.

The students have been working their surnames and date of birth. Along with making sure that we put spaces between our words so others can understand what we are writing.

We have been getting to know each other, what we like, what we don't like, how we can get our mind and body ready to learn, sharing class equipment and space in the classroom.





• Last week we had swimming every day. We all enjoyed going on the bus and being in the water learning to swim. The students learnt to swim different styles, as well as practising water rescues using rope and wearing life jackets. Everyone had fun and loved being in the water.





S5 has had a fantastic start to the year! We've been diving into the novel Holes, exploring different character perspectives and deepening our understanding of storytelling. In Mathematics, we've been strengthening our skills in whole numbers, operations, and time. A highlight of the term was our excursion to Blue Rock Dam, where students learned about water safety and how to respond in critical situations. Another exciting project was our hygiene campaign, which helped us explore different aspects of health and well-being. It's been a great Term 1, and we're looking forward to more learning adventures ahead!







S6 students have been busy building their phonics and fluency skills, writing book reviews, and expanding their vocabulary. Our favourite word this term was 'sprinkle' - and we used play doh to sprinkle lots of things on pizza, yoghurt and cake! In numeracy, we've explored counting, place value, operations, and time, using Minecraft Education and outdoor activities like scavenger hunts and obstacle courses to make maths fun. In Health, we've learned about hygiene through hands-on experiments, including washing Barbie's hair and using science to "scare away" germs





During Term 1, students who participated in the secondary program 'Travel' experienced public transport within the local area and neighbouring communities. The students learned how to use and top up Myki cards and travelled on buses and trains to Moe, Morwell, Yarragon, Trafalgar and Warragul. For some students, it was their first time taking public transport while others had already experienced it.



It was great to see the students have so much fun being out in the community and experiencing public transport.

## Upper Primary Swimming

Our Upper Primary students were involved in their swimming program this week and have shown great improvement in their swimming abilities. They have been practising floating, kicking, jumps and rescues. Well done Upper Primes!


