Our Commitment to Child Safety

Baringa School is committed to providing an environment where our students are safe and feel safe, where their participation is valued, their views respected, and their voices are heard about decisions that affect their lives. 

Everyone who attended completed beautiful designs and should all be extremely proud of their finished artwork.

Jarryd – Today we did art that was a part of Indigenous art. We used lots of colours and symbols. Everyone loved it. Our art turned out great. Montanna helped us with the words and what they mean.

Aaliyah – I loved drawing my koala and had a really fun time.
















Celebrating our Indigenous People at Baringa School


Baringa School Parent Portal

International Day Against LGBTQIA+ Discrimination is a day for standing up to discrimination and creating a safe, inclusive and supportive school environment.


National Sorry Day - 26th May 2025
