School Policy


Health Care Needs Policy

Our Commitment to Child Safety

Baringa School is committed to providing an environment where our students are safe and feel safe, where their participation is valued, their views respected, and their voices are heard about decisions that affect their lives. We promote positive relationships between students and adults and between students and their peers. These relationships are based on trust and respect. Particular attention is given to the child safety needs of Aboriginal students, those from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, International students, students with disabilities, those unable to live at home, children and young people who identify as LGBTIQ+. Speech: AAC

What is AAC?

AAC stands for Augmentative and Alternative Communication. It includes all the different ways someone can communicate without or in addition to using speech.

Aided AAC can include:

- Low-tech tools like schedules or communication books
- High-tech devices like tablets or apps e.g. LAMP WFL, Proloquo2go, PODD systems

The use of AAC promotes a child's speech and language development, it will not hinder it! AAC is not a last resort — it's a powerful support that helps children be heard, take part in daily life and feel included.


